Before departure „Bevor Abreise“

Which important documents must you bring with?

1. Your ID card or visa „Aufenthaltstitel“

Make sure that you have a valid document for staying more than 3 month in Graz.

2. Your Insurance card (AOK, TK, usw.)
No need to change your insurance.
Ask your nearest Kassenstelle in Nürnberg or Erlangen for a EU-wide insurance card.
(It's free by AOK, supposed to be the same with other insurances.)
3. Academic documents
 - 1) Acceptance Letter from both sides
 - 2) Learning Agreement
4. Lease contract „Mietvertrag“
